ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

On June 2, 2022, the International Scientific Conference entitled "Content of the Right to Parental Responsibility in the Legal Orders of Central and Eastern Europe" will be held at the Institute of Justice in Warsaw. The event will be organized as part of the Central European Professors' Network, coordinated by the University of Miskolc - Central European Academy.

In the European legal culture (shaped based on Greek philosophy, Judeo-Christian religion and Roman law) the concepts of family, parenthood, motherhood and fatherhood among the fundamental values that have been questioned in the last few decades. Therefore, there is a need for a scientific reflection on one of the key aspects in this field, i.e. parental responsibility, in the legal systems of Central and Eastern European based similar countries. on constitutional axiology. During the conference, selected problems will be presented, such as: the concept of parental authority and responsibility,

constitutional axiology in the field of parental authority, protection of parental authority in the system of sources of law, the concept of a parent, the concept of a child, rights and obligations arising from parental authority, rights and obligations of parents, the rights and obligations of child in relation to parental authority, rules governing parental authority, special features resulting the content of parental responsibility, parental authority and divorce, the status of a child not subject to parental authority and de lege ferenda conclusions.

The papers will be delivered by scientists and practitioners from Croatia, the Czech Republic, Serbia, Slovenia, Slovakia, Hungary and Poland.

THE INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE

INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE IN WARSAW

The Institute of Justice of Warsaw is a state organisational unit subordinate to the Minister of Justice. The Institute performs scientific and research activities in the area of lawmaking and the application, axiology and social operation of law. It also studies the phenomena of crime and social pathology.

Institute of Justice conducts studies of lawmaking and the application, axiology and social operation of law as well as the phenomena of crime and social pathology. The Institute disseminates the results of these studies and engages in legal education. Areas of the Institute's research include, in particular: the functioning of legal institutions in the practice of the justice system; the effectiveness of legal protection bodies, legal axiology and the professional ethics of legal professions; the role of jurisprudence and grounds for its performance; the system, organisation and functioning of justice bodies, also against the background of social environment; the causes and conditions of violations of law; the size, structure and dynamics of crime and other pathological phenomena and behaviour; the enforcement of legal sanctions and social rehabilitation of offenders; interdisciplinary and comparative studies of the historical development of institutions of Polish law, including those of Polish law's conformity with the norms and standards of international and EU law. In order to disseminate the results of its studies, the Institute is authorised to organise domestic and international conferences, seminars and engage in publishing and documentation activities.

Conducting its research, the Institute of Justice extensively uses scientific studies of case files of judicial and prosecutorial proceedings, reviewing ca. 10,000 files each year. This significant involvement in case file research distinguishes the Institute from other Polish legal research or- ganisations. The Institute also conducts legal and comparative analyses, compiles statistical and economic reports and performs survey studies. More than 400 papers and 70 books have been written by the staff of the Institute's five sections (Section of Criminal Law and Process, Section of Civil Law and Process, Section of Family Law, Section of Economic Studies of the Justice System and Section of Fundamental Rights).

As part of its official business, the Institute works with courts, other justice bodies and the Natio- nal School of Judiciary and Public Prosecution. The Institute engages in international cooperation, taking part in international research programmes implemented by such bodies as the European Commission, Eurostat and the Council of Europe.

















THE CENTRAL EUROPEAN ACADEMY



The Central European Academy (CEA), which is committed to supporting comparative law in Central Europe began its work on the 1st of January 2022.

The aims of the Academy are to manage large-scale research and training projects in Central European countries, addressing both legal professionals and young people interested in the field. In order to achieve its goals, CEA operates the Central European Professors' Network, organizes international scientific conferences and webinars, provides scientific publication opportunities, and creates and manages online professional interfaces. As a result of its activities, the Academy is confident that, in addition to improving the quality of domestic legislation, it will be able to create and support a widely acknowledged professional network involving Central European countries.















THE FERENC MÁDL INSTITUTE OF COMPARATIVE LAW



Established in 2019, the Institute is named after Ferenc Mádl, an academic, an emblematic figure of Hungarian comparative law, an internationally renowned lawyer and President of the Hungarian Republic. In 2020 MFI established the Professors' Network and coordinated and operated it in 2021. The Professors' Network included the following research groups: Family Protection from a Legal Perspective, The Impact of Digital Platforms and Social Media on the Freedom of Expression and Pluralism, Religious Symbols in the Public Sphere and Constitutional Reasoning and Constitutional Interpretation. The MFI also published four books in collaboration with CEA Publishing, and cofounded an international legal journal called Law, Identity and Values.


















THE CENTRAL EUROPEAN PROFESSORS'S NETWORK



CENTRAL EUROPEAN PROFESSORS' NETWORK

In January 2022, the 2022 research groups of the Central European Professors' Network started their activities. The Central European Academy, with the active participation of seven countries (Czech Republic, Croatia, Poland, Hungary, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia) and 36 main researchers, organises comprehensive international scientific activities in four research groups. The main frame issues are: "Right to parental responsibility", "Right to privacy", "Constitutional protection of national symbols" and "Protection of future generations and the environment". The partial and final results of the cooperation, will be made available by each research team on various professional platforms, including conferences, and in the form of publications (scientific articles and books summarizing research results). As a result of its activities, the Academy is confident that, in addition to improving the quality of domestic legislation, it will be able to create and support a widely acknowledged professional network involving Central European countries. The primary aim of the initiative is to create and organise a Central European professional network through closer partnership.
